






Our Tribute to **CHADWICK** BOSEMAN

Who was Chadwick Aaron Boseman? To Fans he was an entertainer, however to family and friends he was more then talent. Chadwick was born on November 4,1976 in Anderson, South Carolina.



is parents were Carolyn and Leroy Boseman. He was immensely proud of his heritage and found through DNA his ancestors were Krio and the Limba people from Sierra Leone. He also traced his DNA ancestry back to the Yoruba People of Nigeria.

In his High School years, Chadwick wrote a play called Crossroad, where he dedicated it to a student which got shot and killed on campus. As he continued his education to college he attended and graduated with a B.A Degree in Directing. He later went to New York where he taught drama until 2008 when he moved to Los Angeles to pursue his career in acting.

Chadwick received the Audelco Award for many plays he wrote. He also starred in many movies, including 42(His Breakthrough Role), 21 Bridges, Marshall and many more. However, it was his role in Black Panther that he will always be remembered throughout History. Chadwick won many Awards from his role in The Black Panther. He won the BET AWARDS (2018) for Best Actor, BLACK REEL AWARDS for Outstanding Actor (2019), NAACP IMAGE AWARDS (2019) for Outstanding Actor. He also won the MTV MOVIE &TV AWARDS for Best Hero playing T'challa/Black Panther, PEOPLE'S CHOICE (2018) for Favorite Male Movie Star as well as SCREEN ACTORS GUILD AWARDS for Outstanding Performance in the film Black Panther.

In 2015, he started dating singer Taylor Simone Ledward. They were engaged in 2019 and married a few months later. The wedding was small and secret with family and friends by their side. In 2016, Boseman was diagnosed with stage 3 colon cancer. It was believed by 2020 the cancer progressed to stage five.

On August 28,2020 Chadwick Aaron Boseman departed this life, in his home with family and his wife by his side. Even though Chadwick's life was shortly lived he made an impact on those around him including his fans. He will never be forgotten because he was more than talent. Chadwick was a man who made History especially for his culture. He will also be remembered for all the love and being a role model for generations to come. REST IN POWER KING, WAKANDA FOREVER!

Accra, Ghana

Cairo, Egypt

For the 3rd consecutive year, Egypt may brag about being some appealing economy in the 9th edition of that report. The country has the benefit of having an important demographic market and is yet one of some favorite places for investors. So according to the author of the report, it is the 3rd year at the top of our ranking. For the past 3 years, Egypt has made important strides in changing its business environment, improving external investment into the market as well as growing their own industries. They took the decision years ago to devalue the currency for being reflective of what is happening in the current market. Even though these were difficult decisions, in the long run, it'll help with structural changes in the economy. We are expecting an approximate 5.3 percent growth rate for the next 5 years. It is above the 4 percent average expected for the rest of Africa, they specified.

The Classic NUBIAN SUN BREAD



The land of ancient Nubia once belonged to extremely progressive African civilizations as the land comprised of two regions which extended along the Nile River. The Nubian history dates back to c. 2000 BCE to 1504 AD, as within different eras the land witnessed both peace and war.

With the availability of rich jewels, extravagant pots, and plenty of copper and ivory the land provided access to trade for the wealthiest of Africa. Egyptians used to call the region "The Land of the Bow" due to the remarkable archery skills of the local natives that lived there. History most evidently exhibits that Nubia has witnessed different dynasties where several small groups of local natives were governed by separate kingdoms. The population of the land consisted of diverse people with varying backgrounds of religious beliefs, norms, and ethnicities. The land was so diverse that archeologists have established and assigned names to different cultures that were followed and practiced by the Nubians at that time. Also, there is evidence from the history that suggests that the Nubians blended in several dif-

ferent customs from the Egyptians since there was a regular practice of trade happening with them. Thus they created their particular manner of unique traditions that were followed. Never the less Nubian Kingdom of Kush was a demonstration of magnificence and opulence with its historical importance still observed by many to this day.

Apart from the rich history that Nubia holds, the land of high rising pyramids with its strong and powerfully built culture was also notable and celebrated for its vibrant cuisine and delicacies that dictated traditions and contained strong influences from the Egyptian culture. The lifestyle that was followed by the natives relied a lot on healthier food options with simple and wholesome food. The water banks of the Nile allowed them

to grow okra, spinach, beans carrots, and many other herbs and spices which were also incorporated for delicious and interesting dishes. Agriculture was the main source of food supply for the Nubian region since the Nile flowed along with the land due to which apart from vegetables, wheat and barley were a noticeable crop that was vastly cultivated. Even today, the Nubian traditional culture is hailed for preserving its originality and customs as recipes are passed down on from generations of Nubians and one such recipe that has been remarkably looked after is the classic Nubian sun bread. This soft bread recipe has been enhanced over time with additions of yeast etc. yet still is a swoon-worthy delicacy and a treat that is irresistible for all ages.

The classic Nubian sun bread feels like a warm comfortable snug providing a perfect homely feel giving you a downright sense of nostalgia while bursting your taste buds with its warm, soft, and perfectly balanced buttery texture. It is also one of the oldest veast bread that was consumed back in the day by the Nubians as it is also referred to as the 'Shamsi Bread' which means sun bread and it is still eaten in some parts of Egypt. Since bread was consumed back in the day as a meal by the Nubians due to its local availability and ample cultivation of wheat crops they mastered different techniques in making it enjoyable and flavorsome. The use of simple ingredients does not only make this bread a convenient every day make but also a pleasant substitute for other everyday bread options. Also, while the bread recipe has been modified according to personal preferences by many, this below-mentioned recipe is the most simple and closest original take on the beloved Nubian sun bread.

RECIPE

INGREDIENTS

- 3 large eggs
- 3 ½ tablespoon sugar
- 3 tablespoon lukewarm milk
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- ½ cup melted salted/unsalted butter (You can use either kind of butter based on your personal preference)
- 2 packets of instant yeast



DIRECTIONS

- Firstly, mix your eggs and sugar well until a smooth consistency is formed.
- Add in your flour in the mixture and beat well. In case you don't have a stand mixer you can easily do this step by hand too.
- In a separate bowl add in the milk and yeast and let this mixture rest for a couple of minutes until the yeast is activated and the mixture begins to get foamy.
- Add in this yeast mixture into the rest of the batter and combine well. Once the mixture begins to form out in a dough roll it out on a flat surface
- Knead your dough for about 5-10 minutes in between using flour and melted butter so that the dough does not stick on your hands and the surface and soft doughy texture is formed.
- Once your dough is kneaded put it into a greased bowl and cover it with a cloth to rest it for a few hours.
- The dough should look like a soft bowl after its resting period and now you will be separating it into two portions so that the classic sun shape can be made.

- Take one portion of the ball and shape it out into a flat round shape just like the sun. Place this on to a large baking sheet that is already buttered. You can also use parchment paper to avoid the bread sticking to the surface.
- Now, take the other portion of the dough and roll out 4-5 smaller dough balls and attach them to your sun's face. You can experiment with these smaller balls by forming different shapes but usually, these are rolled out into either round balls or in a snail-like shape. Once this is done put it all aside for at least 15-20 minutes giving it some time to rise before being put into the oven.
- Now slightly butter your bread so that it comes out perfectly golden from the oven. Put the bread into a preheated oven at 425 degrees and let it bake for 10-20 minutes. To check whether it's prepared insert a toothpick and make sure it comes out clean.
- Your classic golden Nubian sun bread is ready to be adored and relished. You can eat this warm bread with honey, jam, or any other toppings depending on what you want to have along. Eat it with caution because trust me you will find yourself nibbling on this soft and warm bread all day long! But it's absolutely worth it.


In 2015, LaWanda attended a model call for Grade

Vicky Cakes is truly a rising star in the breakfast industry and fulfilling their mission to bring families back to the table!








Black Love & Dating






